QUESTION 1: Which ONE of the following is the best ECG diagnosis?

- Sinus rhythm with PVCs.
- Sinus rhythm with intermittent pre-excitation (WPW).
- Accelerated idioventricular rhythm.
- Sinus rhythm with PACs + RBBB.
- Sinus rhythm with rate-related RBBB.

QUESTION 2: Would you:

- Tell him that the ECG is benign and no further action is necessary, unless he develops symptoms?
- Do further tests to establish whether his heart is structurally normal?
- Do an exercise stress test?
- Refer him for invasive EP studies?
- Prescribe an antiarrhythmic drug?
