QUESTION 1: Which ONE of the following best describes this ECG:

- Acute anterior ST elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI).
- Acute anterior STEMI with RBBB.
- Acute anterior and inferior STEMI with RBBB.
- Acute pericarditis.
- Acute infero-posterior and lateral STEMI.
- Acute anterior STEMI with bifascicular block.
- Other

QUESTION 2: Which of the following would you recommend:

- Immediate thrombolytic therapy or primary PCI (if available).
- Repeat the ECG first before thrombolytic therapy or primary PCI (if available).
- Give NSAIDs and arrange an echocardiogram.
