

QUESTION: Which **ONE** of the following is the most likely diagnosis?

- (a) Missed Tetralogy of Fallot
- (b) Primum Atrial Septal Defect (ASD)
- (c) Chronic pulmonary thrombo-embolic disease
- (d) Mitral stenosis
- (e) Dilated cardiomyopathy with conduction disease
- (f) Kartegener's syndrome (bronchiectasis, dextrocardia, sinusitis, infertility)
