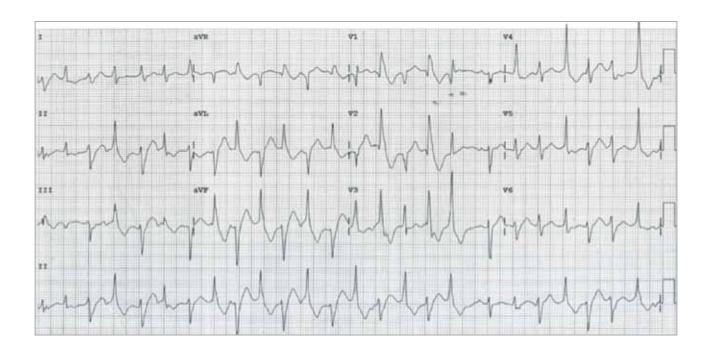




## **Ashley Chin and Rob Scott Millar**

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ECG of a 25-year-old woman presents with palpitations and dizziness during exercise.

## QUESTION I: Which ONE of the following is the best ECG diagnosis?

- 1. Sinus tachycardia with right bundle branch block and ventricular bigeminy.
- 2. Pre-excited atrial fibrillation.
- 3. Polymorphic ventricular tachycardia.
- 4. Bidirectional ventricular tachycardia.
- 5. Sinus tachycardia with alternating left anterior and posterior fascicular block.

The patient is not taking any chronic medication and has a normal general and cardiovascular examination.

## QUESTION 2: What is the resting 12-lead ECG likely to show?

- I. Brugada pattern
- 2. Long QT interval
- 3. "Normal" ECG
- 4. Early repolarisation (J wave) pattern
- 5. Delta waves (Wolff-Parkinson-White pattern)
